Summer 2006, contractors used EPS Geofoam to reduce the amount of concrete fill on the below-grade structure needed for installing pavers in the plaza. EPS Geofoam was also used to create floor elevation changes. Due to heavy snow removal and street sweeping equipment being used in the plaza, high density Geofoam was specified for the project.

Geofoam was also chosen for its ability to insulate the concrete slab where radiant floor heating was installed. In addition to radiant floor heating, EPS Geofoam was also used in numerous planter boxes to reduce the amount and weight of potting soil.
